



CLIMATE OUTLOOK FOR SUMMER 2014 IN SERBIA

It is expected that the summer of 2014 will be averagely warm in entire Serbia, with near or below average precipitation amount.

Mean summer air temperature will be within the range of and somewhat above the multiannual average, which means that this summer will not be as warm as the summer of 2013. August will be the warmest month.

It is forecast that during June, July and August the number of tropical days with maximum air temperature above 30°C will range between 23 and 40, in the Negotinska Krajina area around 50, and in the hilly and mountainous areas around 8. The number of tropical nights with minimum air temperature above 20°C will range around 20 in Belgrade, and between 2 and 10 in the rest of Serbia, with the exception of the hilly and mountainous areas.

It is expected that precipitation amount will be near or below the multiannual average in entire Serbia, with rainy June followed by somewhat drier July and August. It is forecast that in the mountainous areas of central and southern Serbia summer precipitation sums will be above average range due to enhanced convective cloudiness accompanied by heavy precipitation.
